More than half of city's traffic signals damaged, spurring remedial measures

KARACHI: A concerning revelation has emerged, shedding light on the deteriorating state of traffic signals in Karachi, where over half of the city's signals are reportedly damaged. The revelation surfaced during a high-level meeting chaired by Caretaker Sindh Chief Minister Justice (retd) Maqbool Baqir, addressing the pressing issues of traffic management and the is-suance of driving licenses.

Independence under scrutiny

he ongoing Supreme Court proceedings in-volving former Islamabad High Court (IHC) judge Shaukat Azizi Siddiqui have unveiled a complex web of allegations, implicating intelligence agencies, judicial figures, and military influence in the political landscape of Pakistan. The case has farreaching implications, questioning the integrity of the judiciary and the potential influence of intelligence agencies in the appointment and removal of judges. Justice Siddiqui has requested the apex court to cancel the dismissal notification issued against him as an IHC judge. A quick context here: Siddiqui was removed from his position in the IHC, for his speech targeting intelligence agencies when he was addressing the Rawalpindi Bar Association on July 21 2018. He had accused the intelligence agencies of interfering with judicial matters. Subsequently, multiple references were filed against him and he was eventually dismissed from his post on October 11, 2018, after the Supreme Judicial Council decided to dismiss him.

On Friday, the Supreme Court issued notices to former ISI chief Lt-Gen (r) Faiz Hameed, former IHC chief justice Anwar Khan Kasi, former registrar of the Supreme Court Arbab Muhammad Arif and retired brigadier Irfan Ramay after Siddiqui made references to their role in his removal and the court asked him to nominate them since such serious accusations were being levelled against them. These proceedings are being telecast live and the revelations by Justice Siddiqui's lawyer Hamid Khan on what transpired may not be new for many but the implications that the intelligence agencies could get a bench of their choice in a high court or get a judge dismissed is an issue that needs to be addressed. According to a sourced story in this newspaper, the former ISI chief may have a different point of view on what transpired. This is why it may be in the fitness of things - and for a much-needed closure of this chapter - for Gen Faiz to appear before the court. There are still speculations over whether he will appear himself, submit a response or just rely on his sources to give his version in the media rather than responding officially to these allegations at all. As asked by Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, it is also important to understand who exactly was benefiting from all this alleged facilitation. These questions and more need to be answered for sure. For most political observers, the ultimate beneficiary was Imran Khan. However, others point out that Imran was brought into power but he was not the ultimate beneficiary as he was ousted through a vote of no-confidence after three and a half years in power and that the real beneficiary in this case was former army chief Gen Bajwa who got an extension as well. While the answer remains elusive, what is evident is that the democratic process suffered, resulting in an enduring hybrid system.

Whatever the fine print may be, at the heart of this case is the delicate balance between the branches of government and the imperative of a judiciary that operates independently, free from external pressures. The judiciary is the cornerstone of any vibrant democracy, and its integrity is paramount to ensure citizens' trust in the legal system. The Justice Shaukat Siddiqui case brings to the forefront the need to safeguard judicial independence against undue interference and raises crucial questions about the democratic process in Pakistan. The Supreme Court's decision to issue notices to key figures, including former ISI chief Lt-Gen Faiz Hameed, is a commendable step toward transparency. The live telecast of the proceedings, though not without controversy, underscores the importance of public scrutiny in matters of national interest. The allegations made by Siddiqui against intelligence agencies and judicial figures demand a thorough and impartial investigation. As the proceedings continue, it is imperative for the judiciary to maintain its commitment to justice, transparency, and the rule of law. Ultimately, the Shaukat Siddiqui case is not just about one judge; it is about the integrity of the entire judicial system and its ability to withstand external pressures. Pakistan's democracy hinges on a robust and independent judiciary. It is for this reason that there is so much hope for the judicial system to rise to the occasion to ensure that justice prevails and public confidence in the judiciary is reaffirmed.

KARACHI: A devastating incident unfolded in Gulshan Ghazi municipality when a water tanker, re-

turning after delivering water, lost control and crashed into a house. The impact resulted in the unfortunate death of a 40year-old man, identified as Amir, and injuries to three individuals, including two young girls.

The incident occurred as the water tanker, positioned on a slope, suddenly went out of control. The driver, attempting to prevent the vehicle from moving, had placed a cement block under the tire. However, the block broke while water was being poured, causing the tanker to gain momentum downhill. The tanker overturned and collided with a house, causing significant damage. Rescue efforts were

swiftly initiated by police and local residents, who managed to extricate the victims from beneath the wreckage and the tanker. The injured, identified as Naseer Hussain (45), his two-year-old daughter Manahil, and 13-year-old Raheela Dokhtar Ali, were rushed to the Civil Hospital for medical treatment. The police have intensified efforts to apprehend the driver responsible for the tragic accident, who fled the scene, leaving the tanker behind.

In a separate incident in Landhi No. 1, an 8-monthold child named Wali Muhammad lost his life after being hit by a car while playing in the street with his grandmother. The driver, reportedly named Owais, took the child to the hospital after the accident and then absconded. The heartbreaking incidents serve as a stark reminder of the importance of road safety and the need for stringent measures to prevent accidents. Authorities are actively pursuing the responsible parties to ensure accountability and justice for the victims and their families.
